#### Reading

Before leaving your home, check the homepage of the airline to see whether it is possible to check in at home. This might save you hours of irritating queueing at the airport. Of course, it is also still possible to check in at the check-in desk at the airport when you arrive. Make sure that you have your passport ready. The staff at the check-in desk will print your boarding pass for you and check if your luggage has to be put in the hold or whether you can take it as cabin luggage as long as it is not too heavy. Once they have handed you your boarding pass, you can go on to the next point: security check. There you have to remove your shoes, belt and jacket and put everything into boxes. You and all your accessories will be scanned to make sure that you are not carrying any forbidden items onto the plane. After the security check, there is passport control and then you are free to spend time at a restaurant or browsing the shops in the duty-free area. Always keep an eye on the time and listen

to the announcements, because there might be a last-minute change such as a change of the gate or a flight delay. Make sure you go to the gate in good time so that you are there when they announce that your plane is ready to board. This is when the airport ground staff at the gate usually ask to see your passport and boarding pass again for the last time. On the plane, you can put your hand luggage under or in the compartment above your seat. The flight attendants are usually at hand to help you with this, if you have any difficulties. Finally, you can take a seat and wait to hear the pilot's voice with the details of the flight as well as the flight attendants' safety instructions, which are very important. Then all you have to do is relax and enjoy the flight.
